Current World Projects:

Nicaraguan Seed Bank. In 2014, over 30 of us traveled to Nicargua and spent a week with people there. We recently finished ministering to this community by meeting our goal of raising \$10,000 for seed banks! Nicaraguan farmers depend on their harvest to feed their families. Drought, along with lack of knowledge, has led them to become dangerously close to losing their crops. Donations of \$57 gave a family seeds, and access to a project manager that can give them the knowledge and tools they need for crops to flourish.

ELCA Malaria Campaign. Give today and join us in the fight against malaria. Just \$10 is enough to provide a family with an insecticide-treated mosquito net.
